KOSE MOBILIZES IN WICHITA



On March 8th dozens of members of the American Federation of Teachers (AFT) from around the country arrived in Wichita. Attendees from as far away as Alaska and Connecticut came to help

strengthen and energize KOSE and its members through a training and mobilization program AFT conducts annually.

During the week long program participants received morning training sessions on how to engage, organize, and activate workers. Then, in the afternoons and evenings, they developed those skills as they traveled across south-central Kansas conducting worksite visits, knocking on doors and making calls to talk to KOSE members. You may have seen or heard from them yourself.

This year, participants in the Wichita mobilization and KOSE members in the area got a special treat as AFT chose Wichita as the location for the national launch of the "Reclaiming the Promise" initiative.

AFT's National Secretary and Treasurer, Dr. Loretta Johnson flew in to





join speakers Reverend David Hansen from the Wichita Interfaith Alliance and Annie McKay from the Kansas Center for Economic Growth in highlighting the need for workers to stand up and organize to ensure they have safe and dignified workplaces, Kansans receive quality public

NEWS FROM THE CAPITAL

With the legislative session adjorned for the rest of April here are some of the bills and issues KOSE is closely tracking for state workers.

HB 2750

3% Raise vs Losing Longevity Pay

HB 2750 would provide a 3% salary increase for classified state employees with an annual compensation of \$35,000 or less. For each classified state employee with annual compensation over \$35,000, the compensation increase would be mathematically determined according to a sliding scale. KOSE asked for member feedback on this issue and received unprecedented responses. With opinions in at approximately 70% against this proposal, KOSE took a position against the bill. The legislature held a hearing on the bill on Tuesday, March 18th. Several KOSE members testified in opposition

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opposition to the bill and told their personal stories of how it would affect them. KOSE is unaware of any plans for further hearings or for a committee to work the bill.

Gannon Decision

The Supreme Court decision ordering greater funding for education.

While the Supreme Court decision ordering over \$150 million in additional school funding did not specifically mention any workers covered by KOSE, we remain vigilant that any solution to the school funding case is not done on the backs of state workers. **KOSE is actively monitoring several bills and funding discussions to ensure workers are protected.**

HB 2470

Bill to increase the pay of state legislators.

KOSE opposes this bill. Legislators should not be given a raise unless or until the state starts meeting its obligation to fairly compensate state workers for the quality public services they provide.

HB 2519

Bill to switch KPERS to a defined contribution plan.

This bill was heard in the House Pension and Benefits Committee with KOSE members and staff testifying against the bill. The committee heard how much additional costs the state would face in implementing a defined contribution system and how it could affect current workers' retirement plans. There has been no further action on this bill since that hearing.

SB 454

The bill was represented as straightforward pay bill. It is not.

SB 454 provides an "annual payment" of \$300 for certain full-time state employees and \$150 for certain part-time state employees, **eliminates longevity pay**, and requires the executive branch to adopt an overarching philosophy regarding pay plans and to develop a pay plan consistent with that philosophy. This bill may be advanced when the legislature reconvenes in a few weeks. **While your legislator is home, schedule a face-to-face meeting to explain State employees need a real pay raise.**
